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Former Union Minister for Railways who led one of the most transformative phases in Indian Railways' history, focusing on safety, financial restructuring, passenger experience, infrastructure modernisation, and long-term capacity creation. Known for shifting Indian Railways from a budget-driven system to a professionally managed, customer-centric national infrastructure institution.

MINISTERIAL LEADERSHIP – RAILWAYS

- Union Minister for Railways, Government of India (2014–2017)
- Cabinet-level responsibility for railway safety, infrastructure expansion, passenger services, financial reforms, and technology-driven modernisation.

KEY REFORMS & IMPACT

Safety as a National Priority

- Launched the Rashtriya Rail Sanraksha Kosh (RRSK), a dedicated safety fund to:
 - Eliminate unmanned level crossings
 - Upgrade signaling systems
 - Strengthen tracks, bridges, and rolling stock
- Institutionalised safety spending as a non-negotiable, long-term commitment, not an ad-hoc allocation.

Financial & Structural Reforms

- Ended the colonial-era practice of a separate Railway Budget, integrating Railways into the Union Budget to:
 - Improve fiscal discipline
 - Enable long-term capital planning
 - Align Railways with national economic priorities
- Introduced innovative financing mechanisms, including:
 - Public–Private Partnerships (PPPs)
 - Non-budgetary resources
 - Asset monetisation and commercial development

Infrastructure Expansion & Capacity Creation

- Accelerated Dedicated Freight Corridor (DFC) projects to:
 - Decongest passenger routes
 - Improve freight efficiency and logistics competitiveness
- Expanded rail connectivity to remote and underserved regions.
- Initiated large-scale new line construction, doubling, and electrification projects.

Station Redevelopment & Passenger Experience

- Launched the Station Redevelopment Programme, one of the world's largest:
 - Modernisation of stations through PPP models
 - Integration of commercial, retail, and passenger amenities
- Improved waiting areas, sanitation, accessibility for differently-abled passengers, and catering services.
- Introduced Janani Sewa for mothers travelling with infants.

Technology & Digital Transformation

- Introduced Clean My Coach, enabling passengers to request cleanliness services via SMS/app.
- Rolled out high-speed free Wi-Fi at 140+ railway stations, improving digital access for millions.
- Promoted end-to-end digitalisation of:
 - Ticketing
 - Passenger information systems
 - Grievance redressal

Modern Train Services & Rolling Stock

- Introduced next-generation train services:
 - Train 18 (Vande Bharat prototype phase)
 - Tejas Express
 - Humsafar Express
- Focused on speed, comfort, energy efficiency, and global benchmarking.

Clean & Green Railways

- Accelerated installation of bio-toilets across trains to improve sanitation and reduce environmental impact.
- Promoted:
 - Solar energy adoption
 - LED lighting at stations
 - Energy-efficient operations
- Linked rail modernisation with national sustainability goals.

Customer-Centric Governance

- Introduced VIKALP (Alternative Train Accommodation System) to provide confirmed accommodation to waitlisted passengers.
- Actively engaged citizens via social media to:
 - Address grievances
 - Improve accountability
 - Build public trust in rail governance

INTERNATIONAL & STRATEGIC ENGAGEMENT

- Led international cooperation in rail infrastructure and technology.
- Advanced collaboration with Japan on high-speed rail, including groundwork for the Mumbai–Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail Corridor.
- Engaged global partners on best practices in safety, financing, and passenger services.

INSTITUTIONAL & POLICY LEGACY

- Repositioned Indian Railways as:
 - A national logistics backbone
 - A driver of economic growth
 - A customer-focused public service
- Shifted decision-making from short-term populism to long-term infrastructure strategy.
